**Double Chocolate Cupcakes** 

This recipe is good for a chocolate hit. It's basically the same as the Vanilla cupcake recipe, except you add cocoa powder and choc bits, and reduce the amount of flour by half of a cup.

- 1 1/2 cups self-raising flour, sifted
- 3/4 cup caster sugar 3/4 cup milk
- 125g butter, melted, cooled
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1 teaspoon Vanilla Essence 1/2 cup cocoa powder, sifted
- 3/4 cup dark or milk choc bits

Preheat oven to 200 degrees. Grease a 12 x 1/3-cup capacity muffin pan. Alternatively, line holes with paper cases. Combine flour, cocoa powder and caster sugar in a bowl. Make a well in the centre.

Add milk, butter, eggs and vanilla to flour mixture. Using a large metal spoon, stir gently to combine. Add choc bits.

Spoon mixture into prepared muffin pan. Bake for 12 to 15 minutes, or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Stand in pan for 5 minutes before transferring to a wire rack to cool.

Icing: To add more chocolate use one of the chocolate icings from the icing page.



O Icing and Decorations

- 2 cups sifted icing sugar 1 1/2 tablespoons butter, soft 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

- 3 to 4 tablespoons milk

Combine all needed ingredients in small mixing bowl. Stir until smooth and well blended. Adjust for spreading consistency if necessary, adding a bit more milk or more confectioners' sugar. Spread icing or drizzle on cupcakes with a knife.


